A Lenten Pilgrimage to Montgomery, Alabama

April 3-6

St. Paul's Episcopal Church and Christ Church Cathedral invite you to join a Motorcoach pilgrimage to Montgomery, Alabama to reflect upon and be transformed by a visit to the **National Memorial for Peace and Justice** and the **Legacy Museum**. The museum and memorial opened in 2018 and is dedicated to the horrible legacy of racially motivated mob violence and lynching of African Americans.
