WHAT IS GOD UP TO WITH US?

Our ministry priorities are Christian Formation, Outreach, and Pastoral Care. We have recently called a full-time assistant to collaborate with established lay leaders in those areas. We are strong but have room to grow in every area. We desire outreach activities that are transformational for us and for those we serve, so we have streamlined to prioritize our focus on areas of greatest need.

Our worship can be described as "ancient and modern," that is, we are grounded in the Book of Common Prayer, and we enjoy occasional new language and liturgical styles. You might say we are "expansive" and eager to expand our horizons. Our music is supported by highly talented musicians, a fantastic pipe organ, a wonderful organist/choir master, a talented choir, and three delightful bell choirs. We enjoy our favorite hymns and happily sing new ones. We enjoy our children's participation in worship and are looking for more ways for them to be regularly involved. We have been streaming Sunday services since we expanded our capability during the pandemic and have weekly participants.

Prayer and liturgy bring us together. We see Jesus in the people we meet—both inside the parish and outside in our community. People get involved as they are invited and called to our various ministries. We get connected through the things we work on together. The ministries provide opportunities for relationships to flourish. Sermons personalize the experiences—by saying "this is what it looks like when you are trying to live out the ministry of Jesus."





MOVING TO GRACE

Grace members look forward to getting to know our new rector—someone with whom we will work, eat, celebrate, learn, worship, and have fun. We are not inclined to boast but will boast to get your attention. If you can see yourself as our next rector—energetic, collaborative, transparent, and most importantly relational, we offer ourselves, our community, and the region. We want to make it a great experience for you.

While Kirkwood and St. Louis are amazing places to live, the diversity of our region also presents many opportunities to carry out Christ's reconciling and healing work.

The Kirkwood Community: Kirkwood and the nearby municipalities in Saint Louis County are highly appealing. It seems like everything is just 10 or 20 minutes down the road. We are prepared to help our next rector live in our area by offering support to make the transition smooth.

Kirkwood is the kind of place people want for vibrant community life, excellent public and private schools, and a home-town feel. We have an interesting history, beautiful parks, a friendly farmers' market, great recreation and restaurants, and a beautiful new performing arts center within four blocks of our church. Grace is located near the attractive town center, a good place to hang out. It's an appealing community to put down roots.

St. Louis City and the Region: Our region is filled with interesting neighborhoods and fun places and events. Forest Park offers a variety that appeals to everyone: the Zoo, the Muny outdoor theater, golf venues, an ice-skating rink, walking and biking trails, the Science Center, Shakespeare in the Park, the Art Museum, and more. We are proud of our world-renowned Missouri Botanical Garden, the Saint Louis Symphony Orchestra, and other cultural institutions. Sports are big-time in St. Louis: Cardinals Baseball, the Saint Louis Hockey Blues, our new soccer team, City SC, in a brand-new downtown stadium, and other wide-ranging athletic activities. Our region boasts two major rivers, the Mississippi and the Missouri, a lively and respected wine-producing industry, and a multitude of exciting opportunities for outdoor life and recreation in nearby rural areas. The area has a wide range of excellent educational institutions, including several highly regarded colleges and universities.

WHAT WE ASK




- Inspire us to put spiritual life and faith first. Encourage us to meet the challenges presented by competition from schools, sports, and other activities. We hope to be more creative in getting the generations together in worship and at times other than worship. Advise us on how to appeal to people to be more active in the life of the congregation.
- Encourage us in making and maintaining relationships, to knit friendships through a variety of large-group and small-group intergenerational activities. We have found people enjoy coming together in our homes for deeper conversations. We have a knack for entertaining large groups and coming together for fellowship and celebrations.
- Be there for those who are suffering and facing troubles. Be our Good Shepherd when we struggle or are lost.

- Inject variety in liturgy/worship through music and generational participation.
- Partner with our leaders as they find ways to celebrate people's ethnic roots, histories, and traditions.

GET IN TOUCH



If you or someone you know feels called to enter discernment with us as we search for our next rector, the following items must be submitted to: The Rev. Canon Doris Westfall at dwestfall@diocesemo.org by March 4.

- Cover letter stating your desire to join us in discernment
- Current resume
- Current OTM portfolio
- Your responses to the following questions with fewer than 200 words for each question
- o What attracts you to Grace Episcopal Church and Kirkwood?
- o Share with us what is calling you to make a change at this point in your life.
- o How have you unlocked the spirituality of your parish?
- o In today's world, how do we attract and retain the next generation? What methodology has worked for you and what would you do differently?
- Ø If the applicant is recovering from a substance use disorder or other addictive behavior, that nominee shall have had a minimum of five years of continuous sobriety and shall actively be working a program of recovery.
- Ø Consistent with the Baptismal Covenant, we respect the dignity of all persons; therefore, no candidate shall be excluded because of race, color, ethnic origin, immigration status, national origin, sex, marital or family status (including pregnancy and childcare plans), sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, disabilities, or age.
