# **Grace Church History**

"By spring of 1860, the building was completed and, thanks to a number of gifts, pretty well furnished. The gifts, in addition to the window supplied by Mr. Wilgus, were the church bell from Leffingwell, a font from St. John's Church in St. Louis, Bibles from Mary E. Harrison & Carr & Blythe, and prayer books from Messers Bushnell, Woodward & Bailey.



"On May 27, 1860, Whitsunday, Grace Episcopal Church, Kirkwood was consecrated to the service of God. There were two services. At the morning service two adults and

six infants were baptized; and one infant, previously and privately baptized, was received. The names are mostly those we have heard before—members of the Hough, Elliot, Brown and Leffingwell households. Of six candidates confirmed by Bishop Hawks, two were from St. Louis, and one was a slave. In the afternoon Bishop Hawks consecrated the church, the Reverend John Coleman preaching the sermon. The cost of building the church was \$12,000. For 1860 the Parish Register lists thirty-six communicants."

This is an excerpt from the book "Grace Church Kirkwood, Missouri. Its Story." We celebrate Pentecost this Sunday, 163 years later in a newer building, however our mission remains the same. The Purpose of this Mission is to fulfill our baptismal vow to "seek and serve Christ in all persons."

### **Grace Church Wear Orange Day**



The weekend of **June 2-4**, **2023**, Episcopal Churches across the Diocese of Missouri are invited to participate in *Wear Orange Day* in honor of victims and survivors of gun violence across our country. *Wear Orange Day* was born out of a tragic shooting in Chicago.

Thousands of people across the country will wear the color orange to honor the more than 40,000 people who are killed with guns and approximately 85,000 who are shot and wounded every year.

You are invited to a diocesan Prayer Service of Remembrance and Lamenton Friday, June 2 at 6 p.m. at Tower Grove Park in Humboldt South shelter. Bishop Deon will lead us in prayer as we remember those who have died and those whose lives are forever scarred by gun violence. Information will be available about steps you can take to work toward gun violence prevention. Free gun locks will be available as well as information on gun safety for families.

On **Sunday**, **June 4th** we will observe *Wear Orange Sunday* here at Grace. Bishop Deon has invited us all to wear orange, to offer prayers of lament, to light candles of hope, and to work for change.
