Grace Driveway Resurfacing

Have you seen the parking lot lately? If you haven't, come by and take a look!

The last time we resurfaced our parking lot was over 13 years ago. It was showing its age! Over that time, we filled numerous potholes and patched cracks, but it finally came to the point where it was deteriorating rapidly, and patch jobs would not work.

The vestry took a long and hard look at this problem and received several bids for repairs. The vestry approved a proposal from Kane Asphalt & Construction, and the parking lot resurfacing and striping was completed in mid-June for \$14,700. This project was not included in our 2023 operating budget. We received a grant from the Diocese for \$3,000, and some additional funds are available in the grounds budget. The finance committee is working on other funding sources that will enable us not to cut our program budget.

Tuesday Book Club

Our new book we'll be reading is *Every Day Is a Gift: A Memoir* by Tammy Duckworth.



Learn the incredible story of Illinois senator and Iraq War veteran Tammy Duckworth and see what inspired her to follow the path that made her who she is today. In *Every Day Is a Gift*, Tammy Duckworth takes readers through the amazing— and amazingly true— stories from her incomparable life. In Nov 2004, an Iraqi RPG blew through the cockpit of Tammy Duckworth's U.S. Army Black Hawk helicopter. The explosion, which destroyed her legs and mangled her right arm, was a turning point in her life. But as Duckworth shows in *Every Day Is a Gift*, that moment was just one in a lifetime of extraordinary turns. The biracial daughter of an American father and a Thai-Chinese mother, Duckworth faced discrimination, poverty, and the horrors of war— all before the age of 16. From childhood to motherhood and beyond, *Every Day Is a Gift* is the remarkable story of one of America's most dedicated public servants.

Hunger Barrel Items Needed

For kids who depend on the school breakfast and lunch programs, summer can be a challenging time to have regular meals. The following are suggestions from the food pantry at Kirk Care (one of the places we take our donated items).



Preferred items

Non-perishable unexpired foods: Meats (chicken, spam), fish (tuna, salmon) • stew • hearty soups • chili, beans (protein canned or dried) • tomato products • fruits (canned or dried) • pasta, pasta sauces, canned pasta • peanut butter, jelly/jam • ground coffee • rice • breakfast items • low sugar cereal • oatmeal • complete meals & meal kits • dinner mixes (*Hamburger helper, Tuna helper*) • macaroni & cheese • dessert mixes • baking staples • protein/power bars

Non-food items:

Paper products (napkins, kleenex, toilet paper, paper towels) • diapers/pull-ups (all sizes including adult diapers) • feminine hygiene products • bar soap, shampoo, conditioner, lotion • cleaning supplies.
