Be present with those considering a call to serve at Grace Church, that they may listen to your Spirit and follow where you lead.


Bless all those with a part in making this decision with mutual trust and respect.

Grace Church Wear Orange Day



The weekend of **June 2-4**, **2023**, Episcopal Churches across the Diocese of Missouri are invited to participate in *Wear Orange Day* in honor of victims and survivors of gun violence across our country. *Wear Orange Day* was born out of a tragic shooting in Chicago.

Thousands of people across the country will wear the color orange to honor the more than 40,000 people who are killed with guns and approximately 85,000 who are shot and wounded every year.

You are invited to a diocesan Prayer Service of Remembrance and Lament**Today at 6 p.m. at Tower Grove Park in Humboldt South shelter.** Bishop Deon will lead us in prayer as we remember those who have died and those whose lives are forever scarred by gun violence. Information will be available about steps you can take to work toward gun violence prevention. Free gun locks will be available as well as information on gun safety for families.


