Beyond Our Walls

Hunger Barrel Items Needed

For kids who depend on the school breakfast and lunch programs, summer can be a challenging time to have regular meals. The following are suggestions from the food pantry at Kirk Care (one of the places we take our donated items).



Preferred items

Non-perishable unexpired foods: Meats (chicken, spam), fish (tuna, salmon) • stew • hearty soups • chili, beans (protein canned or dried) • tomato products • fruits

(canned or dried) • pasta, pasta sauces, canned pasta • peanut butter, jelly/jam • ground coffee • rice • breakfast items • low sugar cereal • oatmeal • complete meals & meal kits • dinner mixes (*Hamburger helper*, *Tuna helper*) • macaroni & cheese • dessert mixes • baking staples • protein/power bars

Non-food items:

Paper products (napkins, kleenex, toilet paper, paper towels) • diapers/pull-ups (all sizes including adult diapers) • feminine hygiene products • bar soap, shampoo, conditioner, lotion • cleaning supplies.

Travel Toiletries

Are you traveling this summer? When staying in a hotel or motel they often provide you with travel toiletries, as well as coffee service packets, which you may not need.



You can collect these unused items for Trinity Food Pantry and the Person to Person Street Ministry to give to the unhoused. Then, when you return to Grace, deposit your bag in the marked box in the parish hall.
